Marking the end of his role as Wing Leader, CAF Col Sprouse was presented with a plaque and model of the USS Lexington, the ship he commanded.





T-34 Maintenance Review

In keeping with the T-34 Maintenance Review report commenced in the 2016 Summer newsletter, we are going to continue to devote this section to "Everything Maintenance" related to the T-34A. There is a significant degree of work/repair/upkeep necessary to keep the T-34A safe and flyable...and the cost to keep up with this responsibility is not insignificant.

The engine is designed to operate for 1,700 hours before being be considered for overhaul. Of course the Wing routinely monitors the material condition of the entire aircraft, including the engine. Any and all engine related discrepancies are reported to the Wing Maintenance Officer, CAF Col. Curtis Boulware and his maintenance troops at George Baker Aviation. In addition to

routine maintenance, Col Boulware also supervices T-34's annual inspection.

To ensure the Wing has a sufficient reserve of funds to accomplish an engine overhaul, without causing depletion of the Wing's general operating funds, a separate T-34 Engine Reserve checking account has been established. This account is funded thru donations and fifty percent of the recommended \$80 hourly T-34 donation. The funds in this account will only be drawn upon for an engine overhaul. At present the Wing has collected \$7,500 of the estimated \$40,000 required for an overhaul.

T-34A Maintenance Actions Since Last Newsletter

- Removed both cockpit seats and repaired fore and aft locking pins
- Replaced height adjustment arm on rear cockpit seat
- Removed and remounted tire on the left main landing gear
- Repaired leaking left main landing gear brake caliper
- Lubricated all landing gear fittings
- Replaced number 1 engine cylinder thermocouple
- Installed Garmin G5 Attitude indicator in front cockpit
- Flight tested and calibrated installed Angle of Attack Indicator System

This year the task of complying the data required for the application fell to our new Adjutant, CAF Col Tom May, assisted by CAF Cols Shay. The application is due on April 22nd, considered by the Council and reviewed in a public forum on June 2nd. The final award determination will be announced in late summer.

TICO WARBIRD 2017 AIRSHOW

This year when the Wing attended the TICO Airshow in addition to taking our T-34A we also took the Wing Golf Cart (For them what needed help) and the Wing's Jeep....the first time it has been away from home at an airshow! And...was it a hit! The Airshow set an attendance record on Saturday...with the USAF Thunderbirds and the Aero Shell team knocking the cover off the ball with their demonstrations.

CAF Col. The Golf Cart was loaded into the Wing's re modeled PX trailer by CAF Col's Shay and Sprouse and towed to Titusville by CAF Col John Prestopino. The Jeep was loaded onto a rental auto trailer by CAF Col Ralph Caruso, assisted by CAF Col Foley, towed it to TICO on Friday.

During the three day event, the Jeep was the center of attention, go figure? Maybe because there were so many aircraft present, the Jeep drew the most onlookers. The duty of answering questions and soliciting new CAF members was shared between Col's Prestopino, Hollinsworth and Sprouse. The Jeep proved to be an excellent platform for displaying CAF recruiting material.

CAF Col Foley and the golf cart were absent without leave for the better part of Friday and Saturday! The golf cart too became a recruiting tool, showing the Florida Wing's Flag throughout the show!

The Florida Wing's Dome Project

In July 2016, at the 2016 EAA
Oshkosh airshow, the Commemorative
Air Force Headquarters presented its
latest education tool to the CAF at
large. The inflatable Dome Theater was
the practical conjunction that
addressed two recent CAF issues:
Honoring the WASP's, the Women Air
force Service Pilots, the first women
in history trained to fly American
military aircraft and capitalizing on the
success of the Red Tail Squadron's "Rise
Above" traveling exhibit.

For years, the CAF has successfully told the story of the Tuskegee Airmen through the "Rise Above" presentation, contained in a state-of-the-art 18 wheel tractor trailer. The CAF's success using this tool stimulated thinking about using a similar venue to honor the sacrifices of the WASP's.

The Florida Wing sponsored the "Rise Above" exhibit in 2015 for over 900 students, teachers and staff at Southwest Middle School. However, the process to schedule the exhibit was time consuming and afforded little opportunity for deviation once the schedule was confirmed.

The CAF identified a vender who manufactures mobile and inflatable dome theaters, with the capability to project planetarium, wraparound, or conventional video presentations. This tool will provide an expanded degree of flexibility for individual CAF Units.

This past fall, CAF Col's Butch and Diane Stevens, set a course to procure a dome theater for the Florida Wing. The Dome project dovetails with our broader education goals. Although the cost of the Dome theater is significant, it will provide the Wing with the ability to seek out additional audiences and locations currently beyond our traditional classroom setting.

From the Finance Officer:

- We have been informed by several members that they have not received confirmation letters from the CAF HQ recognizing their cash donations. As a reminder, the CAF HQ will provide a letter to the doner recognizing all individual cash donations of \$250 or greater. If you have made a cash donation greater than \$250 and not received your letter, please contact the Finance Officer.
- A reminder to all pilots that the recommended hourly rate for donations to support the T-34 is now \$80; \$40 of which will be deposited in the separate T-34 Engine Overhaul Reserve account.
- The Staff has decided to simplify the way we collect the \$75.00 annual dues to the Florida Wing. The current system has the payment due on each individual's annual anniversary. This requires us to contact people through out the year for dues. We have decided to make April the "Membership Month." March seems to be a logical time to make the change. It's after the first of the year so Christmas and New Years are over and its prior to the time many of our members return to homes up north. During the transition, contact me if this causes a hardship or you paid your dues in November or December. We can make adjustments for the transition to be fair.

From the Operations Officer:

- The annual T-34 pilot sponsor meeting is 1000, April 12th at the hangar. Please go the CAF national website and please take your annual 60-1 test, you MUST take this test or you will be removed from flight status until you do. That's from national headquarters. Its easy and takes about 40 min. Watch 3 videos and take an open book quiz.
- I will be reviewing the operation of the Angle of Attack, ADSB and the new Garmin Attitude gyro during the annual meeting.
- Pilot Status Board Information. Please review your information located on the white "Pilot Status and Qualifications Board" in the hangar. If there are changes or updates please call or email me with the most current data. I will update the board.

From the Safety Officer:

The last word must always be "whatever you're doing 'pay attention to the task at hand! It's very easy to become complacent and not really have your head in the game: moving the aircraft in or out of the hangar; driving the forklift, using the check list and of course flying the plane. Recent aircraft accidents are testimony to the truth that bad things do happen!
